# **INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

The following bills were introduced:

**H. B. No. 656**-Representatives Schaffer, Combs, Law, Hughes, Evans, C., Taylor, Cassell, Trakas, White, D., Setzer, Yuko, McGregor, J., Fende, Collier, Fessler, Wagoner.

To amend section 2950.99 of the Revised Code to increase the penalties for violations of the Sexual Offender Registration Law.

H. B. No. 657-Representative Driehaus.

To amend sections 2903.11, 2903.12, and 2903.13 of the Revised Code to impose the same criminal penalties for assaulting a resident participating in a citizens on patrol program as are imposed for assaulting a peace officer.

H. B. No. 658-Representatives Combs, Evans, C., Fende, Law.

To amend section 4508.08 of the Revised Code to permit public entities to offer motorcycle operator instruction without any tuition fee restriction.

**H. B. No. 659**-Representatives Combs, Evans, C., Uecker, Collier, Fende, Yuko, Carano.

To enact section 4509.106 of the Revised Code to require generally any person who cancels a motor vehicle liability insurance policy to obtain a replacement policy or other proof of financial responsibility, and to require motor vehicle liability insurers to report to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles the names and addresses of persons whose policies are canceled or lapse.

**H. B. No. 660**-Representatives Foley, Yuko, Yates, Seitz, DeGeeter, Stewart, D., Fende, Sayre, Evans, C., Collier, Healy, Ujvagi, Beatty, Boccieri, Skindell, Perry, Chandler.

To amend section 122.075 and to enact section 5537.29 of the Revised Code to require that E85 blend fuel be available at all service stations located on the Ohio Turnpike not later than July 1, 2009, and to permit the Ohio Turnpike Commission to apply for grants made by the Department of Development under the Alternative Fuel Transportation Grant Program.

Said bills were considered the first time.
