**INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

The following bills were introduced:

**H. B. No. 662**-Representative Schaffer.

To amend section 2907.07 and to enact section 109.561 of the Revised Code to modify the offense of importuning, to direct the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation to assist law enforcement officers with respect to enforcement of internet-based sex crimes, and to direct the Attorney General to make state funding grants available to local law enforcement agencies for technology and training related to enforcing internet-based sex offense laws.

**H. B. No. 663**-Representatives Setzer, Combs, Flowers, Peterson, Schaffer, Webster, Collier, Seitz.

To amend section 5739.02 of the Revised Code to exempt from the sales tax sales of motor vehicles used exclusively for vanpool ridesharing arrangements.

Said bills were considered the first time.
