INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 451-Representatives Domenick, Combs, Brown, Wagner, Hood, Allen.

To amend sections 1905.01, 2929.13, 2929.14, and 4510.14 of the Revised Code to eliminate the jurisdiction of a mayor to hear cases in which the person charged has been convicted of or pleaded guilty two or more times to driving under OVI suspension and to increase the penalty for a third or subsequent conviction for driving under OVI suspension.

H. B. No. 452-Representatives Mason, Koziura, Otterman, Yuko, DeGeeter, Fende, Patton, S., Skindell, Key, Sykes.

To enact section 5104.041 of the Revised Code to require type A and type B family day-care homes to procure and maintain liability insurance or a bond, or a signed affidavit by a parent of each child receiving child care from the day-care home acknowledging that the family day-care home does not carry such liability insurance or bond.

H. B. No. 453-Representatives Mason, Boccieri, Sykes, Allen, Yuko, Reidelbach, Skindell, Book, Garrison, Smith, S., Brown.

To amend section 5747.98 and to enact section 5747.64 of the Revised Code to create a tax credit for individuals who purchase a new hybrid vehicle.
