INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 112-Senators Schuring, Fedor, Brady, Miller.

To amend sections 3313.60 and 3313.603 of the Revised Code to require one unit of business instruction in high school as a graduation requirement.

S. B. No. 113-Senators Armbruster, Coughlin, Gardner.

To amend section 1751.01 and to enact sections 1751.69, 3923.71, and 3923.72 of the Revised Code to require certain health care policies, contracts, agreements, and plans to provide benefits for equipment, supplies, and medication for the diagnosis, treatment, and management of diabetes and for diabetes self-management education.

S. B. No. 114-Senators Goodman, Harris, Coughlin, Amstutz, Spada, Wachtmann, Gardner, Jordan, Carey, Schuler, Schuring, Padgett, Fedor, Dann.

To amend section 5533.09 of the Revised Code to designate Interstate Routes 70 and 71 as the "Purple Heart Trail."

S. B. No. 115-Senator Jacobson.

To amend sections 3501.38, 3503.06, 3503.14, 3513.07, and 3513.261 and to enact sections 3501.381 and 3599.111 of the Revised Code to cure omissions in and otherwise clarify the law regarding circulation of election petitions.
