INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bill was introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 322-Senators Gardner, Coughlin, Schuler, Schuring, Wachtmann, Mumper, Jacobson, Carey, Hottinger, Spada.

To amend sections 2903.06, 2903.08, 2903.11, 2923.02, 4507.08, 4510.13, and 4510.54 and to enact section 4510.18 of the Revised Code to require a court to impose a lifetime driver's license suspension for attempted murder by means of a motor vehicle, felonious assault using a motor vehicle, and aggravated vehicular homicide and vehicular homicide under certain circumstances; to permit a court to impose a lifetime driver's license suspension for aggravated vehicular assault; and to establish that driving under these specified lifetime suspensions is a felony of the third degree.
