To memorialize the President of the United States to support the retention of the Continued Dumping and Subsidy Offset Act, which is important to Ohio industries, enabling them to reinvest and remain competitive in the international market.

WHEREAS, Since October 1, 1996, the United States Department of Commerce has completed nearly 400 administrative reviews on 133 distinct anti-dumping and countervailing duty orders. Approximately 80 per cent of those reviews found that dumping or subsidization continued despite the presence of the order; and

WHEREAS, Many Ohio companies have suffered for years under persistent and continued dumping even after a duty order has been set in place, as it has simply become a cost of doing business for offshore competitors in order to drive domestic producers out of business; and

WHEREAS, Ohio's skilled and productive workers have suffered greatly under this problem and have sought relief in the Continued Dumping and Subsidy Offset Act (CDSOA). This law has made a significant difference in the ability of Ohio's manufacturing and agricultural industries to reinvest and remain competitive in today's marketplace. The Congress of the United States passed the CDSOA to encourage fair trade and to help industries harmed by illegal imports; and

WHEREAS, In 2003, over two-thirds of the United States Senate demanded the continued operation of the law despite the politically biased and technically flawed ruling of the World Trade Organization (WTO) that CDSOA is inconsistent with the WTO Agreement on Implementation of Article VI of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) agreement; and

WHEREAS, In early 2004, Congress passed into law legislation and mandated a negotiated settlement with the WTO rather than altering our domestic law, and the Fiscal Year 2004 omnibus appropriations act directs the Administration to immediately initiate WTO negotiations and recognize the ability of WTO members, including the United States, to distribute moneys collected from anti-dumping and countervailing duties to businesses that have won the related trade cases. The Congressional mandate permits our country to meet WTO obligations by obtaining a clarification in the WTO rules themselves; and

WHEREAS, No action has been reported to date by the United States Trade Representative or the Department of Commerce on the congressionally required negotiations, despite specific direction for immediate action and a report within sixty days; and

WHEREAS, Retention of the CDSOA is very important to Ohio's industries and the jobs they provide; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of the State of Ohio memorializes the President to oppose the WTO ruling against the CDSOA and seek to retain the CDSOA to encourage fair trade and help industries harmed by illegal imports, as this important legislation is in the best interest of Ohio's business and industrial base and the state's economic well-being; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the President of the United States, the Ohio Congressional delegation, and the news media of Ohio.
