**REPORTS OF REFERENCE AND BILLS FOR SECOND
CONSIDERATION**

Senator Schuring reports for the Standing Committee on Reference, recommending that the following bill, standing in order for second consideration, be referred to committee as recommended:

To amend sections 109.42, 2929.20, 2950.10, 2950.11, 2967.03, 2967.12, and 2967.26 and to enact section 5120.66 of the Revised Code to require the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction to establish and operate an Internet database that contains specified offense, sentence, and release information for each inmate in the custody of the Department; to grant any person a right to submit a written statement regarding certain possible releases or transfers of any inmate; to require the Adult Parole Authority to consider any such statement prior to granting or recommending the release of or transfer for any inmate; to specify that the above provisions are to be known as "Laura's Law;" and to require that victim or community notification under the SORN Law include a photograph of the registrant offender.

BILLS FOR THIRD CONSIDERATION

Sub. S. B. No. 33-Senators Spada, Jacobson, Amstutz, Schuler, Mumper.

To enact section 1349.19 of the Revised Code to prohibit the sale of a gift card that has an expiration date that is less than two years after the date the gift card is issued and to prohibit, for two years after issuance, any service charges or fees having the effect of reducing the value of the gift card, was considered the third time.

The question being, "Shall the bill, **Sub. S. B. No. 33**, pass?"

On motion of Senator Spada, **Sub. S. B. No. 33** was informally passed and retained its place on the calendar.

S. B. No. 125-Senator Schuring.

To amend section 2151.655 and to enact section 133.152 of the Revised Code to authorize joint county juvenile detention facility districts to enter into agreements with the several boards of county commissioners providing for the

financing of juvenile detention facility improvements, was considered the third time.

The question being, "Shall the bill, **S. B. No. 125**, pass?"
