Senator Austria was selected to preside according to the rule.

The journal of the last legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 180-Senators Coughlin, Hottinger, Mumper, Stivers, Wachtmann, Jordan, Goodman, Wilson, Clancy.

To amend sections 307.081, 307.082, 4582.06, and 4582.31, to enact section 163.011, and to repeal section 719.011 of the Revised Code to prohibit the use of eminent domain authority when the primary purpose for the taking of real property is economic development.

S. B. No. 181-Senators Padgett, Harris, Clancy, Coughlin, Goodman, Grendell, Jacobson, Jordan, Mumper, Niehaus, Schuler, Wilson.

To amend section 1345.03 of the Revised Code to prohibit under the Consumer Sales Practices Act the selling or leasing of specified goods or services during a federal or state emergency at a price substantially higher than that which occurred in the 30 days preceding the emergency.

S. B. No. 182-Senators Fingerhut, Harris.

To amend section 5901.08 of the Revised Code to authorize a county veterans service commission to waive the residency requirement for financial assistance under certain circumstances and to declare an emergency.

OFFERING OF RESOLUTIONS

Senator Dann offered the following concurrent resolution:

S. C. R. No. 20-Senators Dann, Roberts, Hagan, Miller.

To urge the Ohio Attorney General to join the State of Connecticut in its lawsuit against the United States Secretary of Education regarding the mandates of the "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001" or, in the alternative, to explore the filing of a new lawsuit against the Secretary of Education regarding those mandates on behalf of the State of Ohio.

On the motion of Senator Zurz, **S. C. R. No. 20**, was referred to the Committee on Reference.

Senator Wachtmann offered the following resolution:

S. R. No. 114-Senator Wachtmann.

Honoring Michala Ross as a 2005 National Twirling Champion.
