INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 447-Representative Williams, S.

To enact section 2301.511 of the Revised Code to require a county that does not have a community-based correctional facility or a district community-based correctional facility available for the use of that county's courts to formulate a proposal for such a facility.

H. B. No. 448-Representative Williams, S.

To amend sections 313.08, 2901.41, and 2901.42 and to enact sections 109.5731 and 2901.43 of the Revised Code relative to missing persons in Ohio.

H. B. No. 449-Representative Goodwin.

Cosponsors: Representatives Yuko, McGregor, J., Fessler, Evans, Huffman, Brown, Stebelton.

To amend section 4713.01 and to enact section 4713.18 of the Revised Code to specifically allow estheticians, hair designers, manicurists, natural hair stylists, and cosmetologists to operate out of a salon that is a mobile unit if that unit is at least one thousand feet from the nearest salon that is housed in a permanent structure.

H. B. No. 450-Representative Goodwin.

Cosponsors: Representatives Wachtmann, Barrett, Peterson, McGregor, J., Brinkman, Fessler, Gibbs, Combs, Evans, Huffman, Adams, Stebelton, Letson.

To amend section 2923.211 of the Revised Code to permit a member of the armed services or the Ohio National Guard who is between the ages of 18 and 21 to purchase a handgun if the person has received firearms training.
