INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills and joint resolution were introduced:

H. B. No. 460-Representative Batchelder.

To amend section 4707.09 of the Revised Code to allow an apprentice auctioneer to conduct an auction for a charitable organization without supervision by a licensed auctioneer.

H. B. No. 461-Representative Batchelder.

Cosponsors: Representatives Wachtmann, Huffman, Gardner, McGregor, J., Fessler, Combs, Wagner, Webster, Adams, Zehringer.

To amend section 4123.29 of the Revised Code to allow an employer to reimburse the Administrator of Workers' Compensation for the first fifteen thousand dollars of medical bills incurred in any type of workers' compensation claim rather than allow an employer to pay directly only those medical bills incurred in medical-only claims.

H. B. No. 462-Representative Hughes.

To enact section 5.033 of the Revised Code to adopt the bullfrog as the state amphibian.

To enact section 3701.265 of the Revised Code to create the Triple Negative Breast Cancer Commission.

To amend section 3770.06 and to enact section 3317.0212 of the Revised Code to require that a portion of lottery profits be distributed annually on a per pupil basis to public and chartered nonpublic schools.

H. B. No. 465-Representative Strahorn.

To enact sections 503.70 to 503.78 and 503.99 of the Revised Code to permit townships to issue permits for public dances.

H. B. No. 466-Representative Strahorn.

Williams, S., Yates.

To amend sections 109.75 and 109.77 and to enact section 109.762 of the Revised Code to exempt an individual who is appointed to a command position with a police department of an Ohio municipal corporation from Ohio's peace officer certification and training requirements if the individual has served in a command position with a police department of a municipal corporation in another state and has completed a basic training program comparable to Ohio's peace officer basic training program and the other state provides a similar exemption.

H. B. No. 467-Representative Strahorn.

To amend sections 2152.74 and 2901.07 of the Revised Code to require the collection of a DNA specimen from all persons who are convicted of, plead guilty to, or are adjudicated a delinquent child for a misdemeanor other than a misdemeanor for which a citation is issued.

To amend sections 4117.01 and 4117.03 of the Revised Code to eliminate an exemption from the Public Employees' Collective Bargaining Law for specified educational employees.

H. J. R. No. 4-Representative Wolpert.

Proposing to amend Sections 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 15 of Article XI, to amend, for the purpose of adopting new Section numbers as indicated in parentheses, Sections 5 (4), 6 (5), 7 (6), 8 (7), 10 (8), 11 (9), 12 (11), 13 (12), and 15 (13) of Article XI, to enact new Section 10 of Article XI, and to repeal Sections 4, 9, and 14 of Article XI of the Constitution of Ohio to revise the redistricting process for General Assembly and Congressional districts.

To amend sections 4707.02, 4707.20, 4707.21, and 4707.26 of the Revised Code to exempt certain tax exempt organizations and schools that sell at auction items donated to them from license and contract requirements for such an auction, to require those organizations and schools to maintain records of the auction for two years, and to preclude claims against the Auction Recovery Fund for any loss associated with those types of auctions, was taken up for consideration the third time.
