INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 497-Representative Stebelton.

To enact section 5.2239 of the Revised Code to designate the first Saturday following the first Monday in September as "Lithopolis Honeyfest Day."

H. B. No. 498-Representative Fessler.

Cosponsors: Representatives Flowers, Boyd, Lundy, Yuko.

To amend section 5923.05 of the Revised Code to grant annual military leave of up to 408 hours to firefighters and those other public employees who do not work a traditional workweek of 40 hours and to entitle firefighters and these public employees to use such leave to cover an entire work shift any part of which was used to perform military service.

H. B. No. 499-Representative Oelslager.

Cosponsors: Representatives McGregor, J., Hughes, Combs, Barrett.

To amend sections 2109.01, 5801.01, 5801.02, 5801.06, 5801.10, 5803.02, 5803.03, 5804.02, 5804.11, 5804.13, 5804.14, 5804.17, 5805.01, 5805.03, 5806.01, 5806.02, 5806.03, 5806.04, 5808.13, 5808.14, 5808.16, 5810.05, and 5810.13, to enact section 5801.11, and to repeal section 2109.022 of the Revised Code to modify the Ohio Trust Code.

I am directed to inform the House of Representatives that the Senate has concurred in the passage of the following bill:

To amend sections 2151.417, 2151.424, 2901.30, 2949.092, 3313.672, 4511.181, and 4511.191 and to enact sections 120.08, 2949.094, and 5502.68 of the Revised Code to revise the law with respect to law enforcement cooperation and schools' record keeping duties in missing children investigations; to require a court to impose an additional court cost of ten dollars for a moving violation to provide funds for certain costs of drug task forces, certain costs of alcohol monitoring provided to indigent offenders, and certain indigent defense costs; to create the Drug Law Enforcement Fund to be administered by the Division of Criminal Justice Services of the Department of Public Safety for the provision of funds for drug task forces; to create the Indigent Defense Support Fund to be administered by the State Public Defender for the provision of the funds for indigent defense; to provide the funds for the costs of alcohol monitoring provided to indigent defendants out of the Indigent Drivers Alcohol Treatment Fund; to require the court to consider in-state and out-of-state placement options in review hearings for permanency plans for children not to be returned to parents; to require in any such review hearing the court or a court-appointed citizens board to consult in an age-appropriate manner with the child about any proposed permanency plan; to specify that, in certain reviews or hearings regarding foster care placement of a child, custody of a child with a relative other than a parent, or adoption of a child, the foster caregiver, relative, or prospective adoptive parent has the right to present evidence; and to declare an emergency.
