INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 305-Representative Blessing.

To enact sections 4928.71, 4928.72, 4928.73, 4928.731, 4928.732, 4928.733, 4928.734, and 4928.735 of the Revised Code to continue an electric distribution utility's current rate stabilization plan until the Public Utilities Commission determines there is effective competition in retail generation service within the utility's distribution territory and to require the Commission to ensure adequate generating capacity in Ohio through specified means.

H. B. No. 306-Representative Latta.

Cosponsors: Representatives Evans, Seitz, Webster, Combs, Collier.

To amend sections 109.58, 109.60, and 109.61 of the Revised Code to require all law enforcement agencies to take and process the fingerprints of persons arrested for specified offenses and to amend the court's role in ordering fingerprints to be taken from persons who were not fingerprinted when arrested or taken into custody.

H. B. No. 307-Representative Williams, S.

To amend sections 4503.20 and 4509.101 of the Revised Code to require the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to establish a procedure allowing courts to apply for money from the Financial Responsibility Compliance Fund to cover costs incurred by the courts in connection with the enforcement of the traffic laws.

Said bills were considered the first time.
