INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 368-Representative Dyer.

To amend sections 5739.02 and 5739.05 of the Revised Code to provide a two-day period in August each year during which sales of tangible personal property are exempt from sales and use taxes.

H. B. No. 369-Representative Lundy.

Cosponsors: Representatives Letson, Yuko, Brown, Williams, B., DeGeeter, Fende, Book, Luckie.

To amend sections 5739.02 and 5739.05 of the Revised Code to provide a two-day sales tax "holiday" each August during which sales of back-to-school clothing, school supplies, computers, and computer accessories are exempt from sales and use taxes.

To amend sections 5739.02 and 5739.05 of the Revised Code to provide a

To amend sections 4117.01 and 4117.09 of the Revised Code to modify coverage of the Public Employees' Collective Bargaining Law with respect to township fire departments.

H. B. No. 372-Representative McGregor, R.

To amend sections 2101.16, 5747.01, 5903.10, and 5903.12 and to enact section 2101.164 of the Revised Code to exempt estates of armed forces members who died while serving in a combat zone from probate fees, to exempt military retirement pay from the income tax, to provide that reservists and National Guard members may renew their professional licenses within six months after active duty service, and to extend continuing education reporting periods for National Guard members ordered to duty by the Governor.

To amend section 4141.312 of the Revised Code to specify conditions under which a claimant's unemployment compensation benefits are not reduced by the amount the claimant concurrently receives in social security retirement benefits, was taken up for consideration the third time.

The question being, "Shall the bill pass?"

Representative Skindell moved to amend as follows:

After line 41, insert:

"Section 3. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is to provide immediate assistance to individuals who are deprived currently of their full unemployment compensation benefits under Ohio law. Therefore, this act shall go into immediate effect."

In line 5 of the title, after "benefits" insert "and to declare an emergency" The question being, "Shall the motion to amend be agreed to?"
