REPORTS OF REFERENCE AND BILLS FOR SECOND CONSIDERATION

To amend section 3506.21; to amend, for the purpose of adopting a new section number as indicated in parentheses, section 3505.25 (3599.07); and to enact new section 3505.25 of the Revised Code to clarify that an optical scan ballot with more than the proper number of selections for a particular office, issue, or question is invalidated only for that office, issue, or question; to permit midday collection and delivery to the board of elections of optical scan ballots that will be counted at a central location for the March 4, 2008, primary election; to generally prohibit the central counting of optical scan ballots; to terminate the provisions of this act authorizing the midday collection and delivery of optical scan ballots on May 1, 2008, by repealing section 3505.25 of the Revised Code on that date; and to declare an emergency, was considered the third time.
