### INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 327-Senator Coughlin.

To enact sections 5533.633 and 5533.634 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 59 within Cuyahoga Falls in Summit County as the "Sergeant Bryan W. Large Memorial Highway" and to designate another portion of State Route 59 within Cuyahoga Falls as the "Sergeant Justin T. Walsh Memorial Highway."

### S. B. No. 328-Senator Buehrer.

To enact section 5533.811 of the Revised Code to designate a bridge on State Route 108 over the Maumee River as the "Henry County Veterans Bridge."

# S. B. No. 329-Senator Roberts.

To amend section 319.20 of the Revised Code to require a third party trustee's name and address to be included on a real property transfer application submitted to the county auditor for endorsement, when the trustee holds title to real property and is neither the grantor nor the grantee.
