INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 216-Senator Mason.

Cosponsors: Senators Amstutz, Boccieri, Clancy, Coughlin, Fedor, Jacobson.

To amend sections 2950.04, 2950.041, 2950.05, 2950.06, and 2950.13 of the Revised Code to require a person who must register under the SORN Law to provide the address of any residential property owned by the person.

S. B. No. 217-Senator Kearney.

Cosponsors: Senators Schuler, Goodman, Gardner, Miller, R., Miller, D., Roberts, Mason, Schaffer, Boccieri, Padgett, Clancy, Morano, Wilson, Sawyer, Smith.

To enact section 5.2236 of the Revised Code to designate the Saturday before Thanksgiving as "Adoption Day."

S. B. No. 218-Senator Schuring.

To amend sections 124.44 and 124.45 of the Revised Code to permit the legislative authority of a city to grant the mayor authority to appoint the chief of the police or fire departments and to provide alternative procedures for the appointments.

S. B. No. 219-Senator Schuring.

To amend section 2901.13 of the Revised Code to make the period of limitation for the criminal prosecution of a person for an offense directly related to misconduct in office of a public servant the same as the period of limitation for the criminal prosecution of that public servant for the offense involving the public servant's misconduct in office.

S. B. No. 220-Senator Schuring.

To amend sections 2907.01, 2907.22, 2907.23, 2907.24, 2907.241, and 2907.25 of the Revised Code to provide increased penalties for the offenses of promoting prostitution, procuring, soliciting, loitering to engage in

solicitation, and prostitution if the offense occurs in a school safety zone or within 1,000 feet of a school building or the boundaries of school premises.

S. C. R. No. 16-Senator Cates.

Cosponsors: Senators Harris, Cafaro, Faber, Mumper, Buehrer, Austria, Coughlin.

To urge the President of the United States and the United States Congress to secure our nation's borders and to aggressively enforce all existing federal immigration laws.

The question being, "Shall the concurrent resolution, **S. C. R. No. 16**, be adopted?"
