The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

The journal of the last legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 384-Senator Goodman.

To amend section 2105.19 of the Revised Code to generally prohibit a person who is convicted of, pleads guilty to, is found not guilty by reason of insanity of or incompetent to stand trial for, or is adjudicated a delinquent child for committing attempted aggravated murder, attempted murder, attempted voluntary manslaughter, or complicity in any of those attempted offenses from benefiting in any way upon the death at any time of the intended victim and to permit the intended victim to terminate the prohibition.

S. B. No. 385-Senator Fedor.

Cosponsors: Senators Miller, D., Morano, Cafaro, Turner, Smith, Roberts.

To amend sections 3301.0718, 3313.60, 3313.6011, 3314.03, and 3326.11 of the Revised Code to designate section 3313.6011 of the Revised Code as the "Act for Our Children's Future," to establish standards for comprehensive sexual health education and HIV/AIDS prevention education in public schools, and to eliminate the requirement that state health education standards or curricula are subject to approval by concurrent resolution of the General Assembly.

S. B. No. 386-Senator Grendell.

Cosponsors: Senators Wilson, Carey, Cafaro, Padgett, Schaffer, Seitz, Niehaus.

To amend sections 1513.02, 1513.07, 1513.181, 1513.99, 3745.114, 6111.03, 6111.035, 6111.04, 6111.30, and 6111.44 and to enact sections 1513.50 to 1513.59 of the Revised Code to transfer authority to issue section 401 water quality certifications, installation permits for disposal systems, and NPDES permits with respect to coal mining and reclamation operations from the Director of Environmental Protection to the Chief of the Division of Mineral Resources Management in the Department of Natural Resources and to provide for the timely issuance of coal mining and reclamation permits, and to amend the versions of sections 6111.04 and 6111.44 of the Revised Code that are scheduled to take effect July 1, 2009, to continue the provisions of this

act on and after that effective date.

OFFERING OF RESOLUTIONS
