So the bill having received the required constitutional majority passed as an emergency measure.

The question being, "Shall the title be agreed to?"

Senator Carey moved to amend the title as follows:

Add the names: "Amstutz, Buehrer, Carey, Faber, Goodman, Harris, Padgett, Schaffer, Schuler, Seitz, Stivers."

The question being, "Shall the motion be agreed to?"

The motion was agreed to and the title so amended.
