INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 53-Representative Gardner.

Cosponsors: Representatives Boose, Adams, J., Jordan, Wagner, Huffman, Stebelton.

To enact sections 306.322 and 306.55 of the Revised Code to create an additional procedure for subdivisions to join a regional transit authority that levies a property tax and that includes a county having a population of at least 400,000 and to allow a subdivision that is a member of such a regional transit authority to withdraw from the authority.

H. B. No. 54-Representative Morgan.

To amend section 1515.29 and to enact section 6137.112 of the Revised Code to allow a board of county commissioners to adjust the permanent base of a ditch improvement that is used for maintenance fund assessments and to allow a board to use certain ditch maintenance procedures to maintain soil and water conservation district improvements.

H. B. No. 55-Representatives Williams, B., Combs.

To amend sections 959.99, 2152.19, 2903.213, 2903.214, 2919.26, 3113.31, 4732.141, and 4757.33 and to enact section 4731.284 of the Revised Code to revise the penalties and sentencing provisions regarding violations of the cruelty to animals statutes and to include the protection of companion animals in temporary protection orders, domestic violence protection orders, anti-stalking protection orders, and related protection orders.

H. B. No. 56-Representative Miller.

To amend section 1739.05 and to enact sections 1751.69, 3923.651, and 5111.017 of the Revised Code to require certain health care plans to provide benefits for colorectal examinations and laboratory tests for cancer.

H. B. No. 57-Representative Dolan.

To enact section 5.033 of the Revised Code to adopt the spotted salamander as the state amphibian.
