(3) No construction contracts have been entered into, other than for design work related to the project, or construction of the project has been completed.

(4) Assistance provided by the Ohio School Facilities Commission under Chapter 3318. of the Revised Code is not being used for the project.

(5) After taking into consideration the protection of public health and safety and the protection of the physical integrity of existing state facilities, the Director has concluded the project is not a critical one.

(B) Upon making the determination required under division (A) of this section, the Director shall submit to the Controlling Board and to the General Assembly a list that includes a brief description of each such project, its current status, and the estimated expenditures yet to be made for the project. Money reappropriated for any such project shall not be released unless otherwise determined by the Controlling Board.

(C) This section applies notwithstanding section 126.14 of the Revised Code."
