In memory of the Honorable Dale N. Van Vyven.

WHEREAS, The members of the House of Representatives of the 128th General Assembly of Ohio were deeply saddened to learn of the death of the Honorable Dale N. Van Vyven and extend our heartfelt condolences to his family and friends; and

WHEREAS, Dale Van Vyven left an indelible impression on the people whose lives he touched, and he will be remembered as a spirited individual who contributed immeasurably to the world around him. A member of the Ohio House of Representatives from 1978 through 2000, he chaired the Health, Retirement, and Aging Committee and sponsored legislation that changed the disability program for the state's public pension funds, and he was selected as a delegate to the 2000 Republican National Convention; and

WHEREAS, Dale Van Vyven's regard for improving the quality of life in our society was clearly evident in his personal sacrifices of time and effort to his family, friends, and community. An insurance agent for State Farm for thirty years, he served as an at-large member and president of the Sharonville City Council, as a senior director of the Governmental Policy Group, and as a member of the Ohio Retirement Study Council, and he was active with such organizations as the National Association of Life Underwriters, the Sharonville Chamber of Commerce, the Kiwanis Club of Sharonville, the Dan Beard Council of the Boy Scouts of America, and Calvary Episcopal Church. Giving generously of his energy and abilities in all of his endeavors, he displayed exceptional concern and insight, and his absence will be keenly felt; and

WHEREAS, A loving husband to his wife, Anne, and a devoted father to his six children, Pamela, Stacey, Margo, Eric, Meredith, and Stuart, Dale Van Vyven always used his talents to the benefit of others, and the laurels of his life stand as a tribute not only to him but also to those he left behind. Although the void his death has created can never be filled, the legacy of care and

commitment he established will surely live on. The world is a richer place for his having been in it, and he will be sorely missed; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the House of Representatives of the 128th General Assembly of Ohio, in adopting this Resolution, express a profound sense of loss and sincere regret at the death of the Honorable Dale N. Van Vyven and, in so doing, pay tribute to the memory of a truly unique individual; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit a duly authenticated copy of this Resolution to the family of the Honorable Dale N. Van Vyven.
