INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 265-Representative Driehaus.

Cosponsors: Representatives Stewart, Mallory, Murray, Bolon, Yuko.

To amend sections 2903.11, 2903.12, and 2903.13 of the Revised Code to impose the same criminal penalties for assaulting a resident participating in a uniformed police volunteer program as are imposed for assaulting a peace officer.

H. B. No. 266-Representative Koziura.

Cosponsors: Representatives Boose, Boyd, Brown, Celeste, Domenick, Hagan, Murray, Okey, Pryor, Ujvagi, Williams, B.

To enact section 4511.204 of the Revised Code to generally prohibit driving a vehicle while using a handheld or manually operated mobile communication device.

Said bills were considered the first time.
