INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 90-Senators Kearney, Seitz.

Cosponsors: Senators Wagoner, Morano, Goodman, Smith, Turner, Schiavoni.

To enact section 5709.89 of the Revised Code to authorize local governments to exempt homes that have been vacant for at least twelve months from non-school district property taxation for up to three years when purchased by an owner-occupant.

S. B. No. 91-Senator Miller, R.

Cosponsors: Senators Miller, D., Morano, Smith, Kearney, Turner, Strahorn.

To amend sections 4112.02, 4112.05, 4112.08, and 4112.14 of the Revised Code to specify that discrimination by an employer against any person because of the person's credit history is an unlawful discriminatory practice under the Ohio Civil Rights Law.

S. B. No. 92-Senator Miller, R.

Cosponsors: Senators Morano, Grendell, Seitz, Kearney, Strahorn, Smith.

To amend sections 5149.02 and 5149.10 of the Revised Code to limit a member of the Ohio Parole Board who is not a victim representative to two six-year terms.

S. B. No. 93-Senator Buehrer.

Cosponsors: Senators Coughlin, Faber, Miller, R., Morano, Patton, Schaffer, Schuring, Seitz, Wagoner.

To enact sections 149.32 and 149.321 of the Revised Code to establish the War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission, to prescribe the Commission's powers and duties, and to repeal sections 149.32 and 149.321 of the Revised Code on December 31, 2015, to terminate the commission on that date.
