The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

The journal of the last legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 101-Senators Carey, Wilson.

Cosponsors: Senators Buehrer, Grendell, Hughes, Miller, D., Morano, Sawyer, Schaffer, Schuring, Smith, Turner, Wagoner.

To create the Ohio Beekeepers Task Force.

S. B. No. 102-Senator Turner.

To require the State Board of Education to recommend performance standards for dropout programs operated by school districts.

S. B. No. 103-Senator Schuler.

Cosponsors: Senators Seitz, Turner.

To enact section 2907.324 of the Revised Code to prohibit a minor, by use of a telecommunications device, from recklessly creating, receiving, exchanging, sending, or possessing a photograph or other material showing a minor in a state of nudity.

S. B. No. 104-Senators Faber, Fedor.

Cosponsors: Senators Gibbs, Patton, Schaffer, Schuring, Seitz, Turner, Strahorn.

To amend section 5923.05 of the Revised Code to grant annual military leave of up to 408 hours to firefighters and those other public employees who do not work a traditional workweek of 40 hours and to entitle firefighters and these public employees to use such leave to cover an entire work shift any part of which was used to perform military service.

S. B. No. 105-Senator Patton.

Cosponsor: Senator Seitz.

To enact section 4931.71 of the Revised Code to prohibit broadcasting an actual 9-1-1 call that has been made available as a public record and to prescribe a penalty.

S. B. No. 106-Senators Buehrer, Kearney.

Cosponsors: Senators Miller, R., Schuler, Seitz, Turner.

To amend sections 2101.16, 2107.76, 2111.05, 2111.18, 2305.19, and 5815.31 of the Revised Code to exclude from the application of the savings statute certain estate and trust proceedings that have limitation periods, to raise the threshold amount for the termination or avoidance of guardianships of small estates of wards, to raise the threshold amount for the avoidance of guardianship upon the settlement of claims of minors or adult incompetents, and to clarify that termination of marriage revokes any trust provision conferring a beneficial interest on the former spouse.

S. B. No. 107-Senator Kearney.

Cosponsors: Senators Turner, Miller, D., Sawyer, Miller, R.

To amend sections 4112.01 and 4112.05 and to enact sections 2933.84 and 4112.024 of the Revised Code to specify that it is an unlawful discriminatory practice that is within the jurisdiction of the Ohio Civil Rights Commission for any law enforcement agency or officer in Ohio to engage in racial profiling; to require the Commission to compile data from law enforcement agencies regarding routine or spontaneous investigatory activities of the agencies' officers and analyze the data for significantly significant disparities related to the race, ethnicity, national origin, or gender of the subjects of the activities; to provide for Commission access to LEADS to obtain the data and require law enforcement agencies to enter the data on LEADS; and to require law enforcement agencies to maintain a policy designed to eliminate racial profiling by the agency and its officers and to cease existing practices by the agency and its officers that permit or encourage racial profiling.

OFFERING OF RESOLUTIONS
