The journal of the last legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 114-Senator Fedor.

Cosponsors: Senators Cafaro, Miller, D., Wagoner, Turner, Morano, Seitz, Schuler, Strahorn, Schiavoni, Smith, Grendell.

To enact section 5.2265 of the Revised Code to designate August as "Ohio Military Family Month."

S. B. No. 115-Senator Fedor.

Cosponsors: Senators Cafaro, Miller, D., Wagoner, Turner, Morano, Seitz, Schuler, Strahorn, Schiavoni, Smith, Grendell.

To enact sections 3301.60, 3301.61, 3301.62, 3301.63, and 3301.64 of the Revised Code to ratify the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children and to establish the State Council on Educational Opportunity for Military Children and other offices to implement the state's participation in the compact.

OFFERING OF RESOLUTIONS

Senator Stewart offered the following concurrent resolution:

S. C. R. No. 10-Senator Stewart.

Cosponsors: Senators Hughes, Patton, Buehrer, Miller, D., Carey, Goodman, Cates, Wilson, Wagoner.

To memorialize the Congress of the United States, the Secretary of the Treasury, and the Internal Revenue Service to withdraw application of the new federal income tax withholding schedules to pensioners.

The question being, "Shall the concurrent resolution, **S. C. R. No. 10**, be adopted?"

Dear Senate President Harris:

In accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 4911.17, I have the honor to present to you for advice and consent of the Ohio Senate the appointment of

Ms. Karen "Dee" Osterfeld to the Ohio Consumer's Counsel Governing Board.

Pursuant to statute, the Governing Board is comprised of nine members consisting of three representatives from each of the following groups: organized labor, residential consumers, and family farmers. Additionally, Ohio law requires that no more than five members of the Governing Board be from the same political party. Ms. Osterfeld allows us to meet all these requirements because she is a Republican representing organized labor. In addition, she brings to this position the positive attribute of having a strong record of many years of work in law enforcement. Ms. Osterfeld's biography is enclosed for your review.

The request for appointment is respectfully submitted to both you and the Ohio Senate for your advice and consent. If you have any questions or require additional information, please do not hesitate to contact me.
