To amend section 3517.10 of the Revised Code to require each campaign committee that receives a contribution from an individual that exceeds \$100 to identify the individual's employer on the campaign committee's campaign finance statements and to require an individual who makes a contribution exceeding \$100 to a campaign committee to provide the name of the individual's employer to the campaign committee at the time the contribution is made.
