To enact sections 149.32 and 149.321 of the Revised Code to establish the War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission, to prescribe the Commission's powers and duties, and to repeal sections 149.32 and 149.321 of the Revised Code on December 31, 2015, to terminate the commission on that date, were taken up.

The question being,"Shall the Senate concur in the House amendments to **Am. S. B. No. 93**?"

Senator Morano moved that the House amendments to **Am. S. B. No. 93**, be informally passed and retain its place on the calendar.

### INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 206-Senator Grendell.

Cosponsor: Senator Husted.

To amend sections 3517.13 and 3517.992 of the Revised Code to limit to \$500 the amount of political contributions that may be made by or accepted

from the principals and key employees of an entity that is applying for a license or other authorization, or that is licensed or otherwise authorized, to operate video lottery terminal games or a casino in this state.

### S. B. No. 207-Senator Sawyer.

Cosponsors: Senators Turner, Cafaro, Schiavoni, Morano.

To amend sections 3301.0714 and 3314.013, to enact sections 3301.94, 3314.23, and 3333.0410, and to repeal section 3314.033 of the Revised Code to lift the moratorium on Internet- or computer-based community schools, to require the State Board of Education to adopt by rule its recommended standards for those schools and other electronic educational courses, to permit the Department of Education and the Chancellor of the Board of Regents to establish a longitudinal student data system and to declare an emergency.

### S. B. No. 208-Senator Grendell.

Cosponsors: Senators Seitz, Hughes.

To enact sections 2915.25 and 3770.211 of the Revised Code to require criminal records checks of certain persons involved in the operation of casino facilities or video lottery terminals and to prohibit any person convicted of a felony from being involved in these operations.

### S. B. No. 209-Senator Schaffer.

Cosponsor: Senator Carey.

To amend sections 101.27 and 141.011 of the Revised Code to reduce salaries of General Assembly members, the Governor and Lieutenant Governor, and administrative department heads by five per cent.
