The House met pursuant to adjournment.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 108-Representatives Gerberry, Hagan.

To amend sections 959.131 and 959.99 of the Revised Code to specifically prohibit an owner of a kennel of dogs from committing cruel treatment of a companion animal and to give a prosecutor who prosecutes an owner of a kennel of dogs who commits cruel treatment of a companion animal discretion in prosecuting the owner for the offense.

H. B. No. 109-Representative Williams.

Cosponsors: Representatives Hollington, Hagan.

To enact section 3321.30 of the Revised Code to require parents of students enrolled in school districts rated continuous improvement or lower to attend a parent-teacher conference.

H. B. No. 110-Representative Williams.

Cosponsors: Representatives Goyal, Letson, Antonio.

To amend sections 169.01, 169.02, 169.03, 169.06, 169.08, 169.13, 169.14, and 169.16 of the Revised Code to require the director of commerce to provide the office of budget and management with the proper data file to withhold from an unclaimed funds payment for any legal amount in an agreement to compensate a registered finder and to pay that amount directly to the finder and to make other changes in the Unclaimed Funds Law.

H. B. No. 111-Representative Williams.

To amend section 5747.01 and to enact section 5747.014 of the Revised Code to authorize an income tax deduction for small business owners' reinvestment of undistributed profits in business property, employee training, or research and development.

H. B. No. 112-Representatives Grossman, Letson.

Cosponsors: Representatives Murray, Stinziano, Beck, Garland, Ruhl, Fedor, Antonio, Carey, Combs, Newbold, Stebelton, Fende.

To enact section 2927.28 of the Revised Code to require the inclusion of a bittering agent in engine coolant and antifreeze.

H. B. No. 113-Representative Lundy.

Cosponsors: Representatives Hagan, Gentile, Goyal, Williams, Szollosi, Clyde, Okey, Phillips, O'Brien, Murray, DeGeeter, Ramos, Foley, Driehaus, Pillich, Budish, Antonio, Yuko, Patmon, Milkovich, Gerberry, Stinziano, Letson, Boyd, Fende, Slesnick, Ashford, Celeste, Fedor, Garland, Mallory, Sykes.

To amend sections 121.22 and 149.43 of the Revised Code to enact "The Taxpayer's Right to Know Act," specifying that records of public-private partnerships that perform or assist with state functions are public records, and that such entities must conduct official business in open meetings.

H. B. No. 114-Representative McGregor.

To make appropriations for programs related to transportation and public safety for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, and to provide authorization and conditions for the operation of those programs.

H. B. No. 115-Representative Stebelton.

Cosponsors: Representatives Beck, Blair, Blessing, Brenner, Butler, Derickson, Grossman, Huffman, Adams, J., Martin, Mecklenborg, Newbold, Sears, Snitchler, Stautberg, Uecker.

To amend section 3310.02 of the Revised Code to gradually increase to 20,000 the number of Educational Choice Scholarships awarded annually.

H. B. No. 116-Representative Barnes.

Cosponsors: Representatives Patmon, Fedor, Yuko, Letson, Antonio.

To amend sections 3313.666 and 3313.667 of the Revised Code to enact the School Day Security and Anti-Bullying Act to require age-appropriate instruction on and parental notification of public schools' policies prohibiting harassment, intimidation, or bullying.

H. B. No. 117-Representative Barnes.

Cosponsors: Representatives O'Brien, Bulp, Patmon, Blessing, Gardner, Pillich, Carey, Boose, Fedor, Antonio, Yuko, Dovilla, Letson, Blair, Slesnick.

To enact section 5533.932 of the Revised Code to designate the portion of Interstate 480 located within Garfield Heights in Cuyahoga County the "Corporal Brad Anthony Davis Memorial Highway."

H. B. No. 118-Representative Fende.

Cosponsors: Representatives Combs, Yuko, O'Brien, Maag, Hackett, Buchy, Mallory, Blessing, Szollosi, DeGeeter, Bulp, Boyd, Winburn.

To amend sections 149.43, 2903.01, 2903.11, 2903.12, 2903.13, 2903.21, and 2929.04 and to enact section 2903.23 of the Revised Code to provide that residential and familial information of a probation officer is not a public record, to increase the penalties for certain offenses when a judge or magistrate is the victim, to prohibit a person from threatening a judge or magistrate, and to make the killing of a judge or magistrate an aggravating circumstance for the imposition of the death penalty for aggravated murder.

H. B. No. 119-Representatives Combs, Fende.

To amend sections 4713.01 and 4713.08 and to enact section 4713.50 of the Revised Code regarding the regulation of chemical tanning applications and the use of tanning services by individuals under 18 years of age.

**REPORTS OF STANDING AND SELECT COMMITTEES AND BILLS

Representative J. Adams reported for the Rules and Reference Committee recommending that the following House Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration.

H.B. No. 105 - Representative Murray, et al

TO ALLOW AN EMPLOYEE WHO IS A VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE TO TAKE UNPAID LEAVE FOR PURPOSES RELATING TO THE INCIDENT OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, TO ALLOW AN EMPLOYEE WHO IS A VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE TO FILE A CIVIL ACTION AGAINST THAT EMPLOYEE'S EMPLOYER IF THE EMPLOYER TERMINATES THE EMPLOYEE AS A RESULT OF THE EMPLOYEE TAKING UNPAID LEAVE FOR PURPOSES RELATING TO

THE INCIDENT OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, TO ALLOW A TENANT WHO IS A VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE TO TERMINATE A RENTAL AGREEMENT OR HAVE THE TENANT'S NAME REMOVED FROM THE RENTAL AGREEMENT UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES, TO REQUIRE A LANDLORD OF A TENANT WHO IS A VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OR MENACING BY STALKING TO CHANGE THE LOCK TO THE DWELLING UNIT WHERE THE TENANT RESIDES UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES, TO REQUIRE A METROPOLITAN HOUSING AUTHORITY TO TRANSFER A TENANT WHO IS A VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OR MENACING BY STALKING IF THE TENANT REQUESTS SUCH A TRANSFER AND PROVIDES THE METROPOLITAN HOUSING AUTHORITY WITH CERTAIN SPECIFIED INFORMATION, AND TO PROHIBIT A COUNTY, MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, TOWNSHIP, OR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OF SUCH A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION FROM CHARGING ANY VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE A FEE FOR ASSISTING THE VICTIM.

H.B. No. 106 - Representative Pillich, et al

TO ENABLE MEMBERS OF THE ARMED SERVICES AND THE OHIO NATIONAL GUARD TO TERMINATE A RENTAL AGREEMENT WHEN THE MEMBER RECEIVES MILITARY ORDERS TO DEPLOY OR FOR A PERMANENT CHANGE OF STATION.

To the committee on Financial Institutions, Housing, and Urban Development

H.B. No. 107 - Representatives Damschroder and Slesnick, et al

TO REQUIRE THAT MOTOR VEHICLES CARRY ONLY ONE LICENSE PLATE, TO BE DISPLAYED ON THE REAR OF THE VEHICLE.
