Hall of the House of Representatives, Columbus, Ohio Wednesday, March 2, 2011, 1:30 p.m.

The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Bob Hostetler of the Cobblestone Community Church in Oxford, Ohio, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The journal of yesterday was read and approved.

# INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 137-Representatives Phillips, Driehaus.

Cosponsors: Representatives Murray, Lundy, Yuko, Hagan, R., Foley, Szollosi, Okey, Pillich, Garland, Clyde.

To amend sections 121.083, 1349.61, 4111.02, 4111.14, 4113.15, 4115.03, 4121.01, 4123.01, 4123.026, 4141.01, and 5747.01 and to enact sections 4175.01 to 4175.18 and 4175.99 of the Revised Code to create a generally uniform definition of employee for specified labor laws and to create a uniform standard to determine whether an individual performing services for an employer is an employee of that employer.

# **H. B. No. 138**-Representative Gerberry.

Cosponsors: Representatives Hagan, R., Fedor, Yuko, Letson, Phillips.

To amend sections 109.73, 317.08, 959.131, 1717.01, 1717.04, 1717.06, and 1717.09 of the Revised Code to require a person to file proof of successful completion of training with the county recorder prior to being appointed as a humane society agent and to require the revocation of an appointment under certain circumstances.

# H. B. No. 139-Representative McKenney.

Cosponsors: Representatives Clyde, Schuring, Sykes.

To amend sections 145.01, 145.011, 151.04, 154.01, 185.03, 185.05, 3304.30, 3305.01, 3333.045, 3333.11, 3333.111, 3333.611, 3334.01, 3345.04, 3345.12, 3345.121, 3345.17, 3345.201, 3345.28, 3345.281, 3345.31, 3345.32, 3345.34, 3345.50, 3345.51, 3345.71, 3350.10, 3350.11, 3350.12, 3350.13, and 3350.14 of the Revised Code and Sections 371.10, 371.20.80, and 371.40.90 of Am. Sub. H.B. 1 of the 128th General Assembly and Section 105.45.20 of Sub. H.B. 462 of the 128th General Assembly to rename the Northeastern Ohio Universities Colleges of Medicine and Pharmacy as the Northeast Ohio Medical University and to declare an emergency.

Said bills were considered the first time.

Relative to the election of Christina Hagan to fill the vacancy in the membership of the House of Representatives created by the resignation of Todd Snitchler of the 50th House District.

WHEREAS, Section 11 of Article II, Ohio Constitution provides for the filling of a vacancy in the membership of the House of Representatives by election by the members of the House of Representatives who are affiliated with the same political party as the person last elected to the seat which has become vacant; and

WHEREAS, Todd Snitchler of the 50th House District has resigned as a member of the House of Representatives of the 129th General Assembly effective February 28, 2011, thus creating a vacancy in the House of Representatives; therefore be it

RESOLVED, By the members of the House of Representatives who are affiliated with the Republican party that Christina Hagan, Republican, having the qualifications set forth in the Ohio Constitution and the laws of Ohio to be a member of the House of Representatives from the 50th House District, is hereby elected, effective March 2, 2011, pursuant to Section 11 of Article II, Ohio Constitution, as a member of the House of Representatives from the 50th House District, to fill the vacancy created by the unexpired portion of the term of said Todd Snitchler, ending on December 31, 2012; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be spread upon the pages of the Journal of the House of Representatives together with the yeas and nays of the members of the House of Representatives affiliated with the Republican party voting on the resolution, and that the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall certify the resolution and vote on its adoption to the Secretary of State.
