INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 604-Representative Patmon.

To amend sections 4722.02 and 4745.01 and to enact sections 4785.01 to 4785.17, 4785.20, and 4785.99 of the Revised Code to require licensure of residential construction contractors and to create the Residential Builders' and

Maintenance and Alteration Contractors' Licensing Board to regulate the licensure and performance of residential construction contractors.

H. B. No. 605-Representative Huffman.
Cosponsor: Representative Blessing.

To amend sections 109.54, 2915.01, 2915.02, and 3770.03 of the Revised Code to permit the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation to investigate criminal activity involving the operation of a scheme of chance under the Gambling Law, to require the State Lottery Commission to adopt rules describing certain prohibited schemes of chance that use an electronic device to reveal the results, and to make other changes related to schemes of chance.
