INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 155-Senators Cates, Sawyer.

Cosponsors: Senators Wilson, Brown, Turner, Bacon, Oelslager, Gillmor, Wagoner, Jones, Beagle, Grendell, Obhof, Hughes, Kearney, Tavares.

To enact section 5.2267 of the Revised Code to designate February 20 as "John Glenn Friendship 7 Day."

S. B. No. 156-Senator Patton.

To enact section 5533.373 of the Revised Code to designate the portion of Interstate 77 located within the city of Broadview Heights as the "Senior Airman Alecia Good Memorial Highway."

S. B. No. 157-Senator Patton.

Cosponsors: Senators Lehner, Kearney, Bacon.

To enact section 4511.111 of the Revised Code to authorize the use of traffic signs warning of the presence of a child with a disability.

S. B. No. 158-Senator Patton.

To enact section 5533.353 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of Pearl Road within Cuyahoga County as the "Lance Corporal David Mendez Ruiz Memorial Highway."

S. B. No. 159-Senators Seitz, Grendell.

Cosponsor: Senator Wagoner.

To enact section 3345.55 of the Revised Code to permit the board of trustees of a state institution of higher education to enter into an agreement to convey certain property to a conduit entity which will enter into a lease-leaseback arrangement with an independent funding source.

S. B. No. 160-Senators Bacon, Hughes.
Cosponsor: Senator Patton.

To amend sections 2152.86, 2903.03, 2929.20, 2930.03, 2930.06, 2930.16, 2950.01, 2967.03, 2967.12, 2967.121, 2967.26, 2967.28, 5120.66, 5149.07, 5149.10, and 5149.101 of the Revised Code to require automatic notice to victims of first, second, or third degree felony offenses of violence of certain prisoner or alleged juvenile offender release or transfer proceedings; to expand victim participation in parole hearings; to require five years of post-release control for offenders who commit first, second, or third degree felony offenses of violence; to require the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction to keep information on such offenders in a publicly accessible database for ten years following final discharge; to require the Department to provide certain information related to paroles to designated public officials; to require the Department to notify the appropriate prosecuting attorney when a felon serving a specified sentence is released pursuant to a pardon, commutation of sentence, parole, or completed prison term; to prohibit the Parole Board from considering a sentence in effect since July 1, 1996, in making parole determinations; to make other changes related to the release of prisoners and victim's rights; to provide that voluntary manslaughter committed with a sexual motivation is a sexually oriented offense, makes an offender or juvenile offender registrant who commits it a tier III sex offender/child-victim offender, and may qualify a juvenile offender registrant who commits it as a public registry-qualified juvenile offender registrant; and to name the victim and family notification provisions Roberta's Law.
