INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 161-Senator Kearney.

Cosponsors: Senators Turner, Sawyer.

To direct the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services to adopt rules governing the use of the Federal Parent Locator Service by the Office of Child Support.

S. B. No. 162-Senator Kearney.

Cosponsors: Senators Turner, Smith, Sawyer.

To require the Department of Job and Family Services to conduct a feasibility study of current trends in the placement of children by public children services agencies into relative caregiver homes.

S. B. No. 163-Senator Kearney.

Cosponsors: Senators Turner, Cates, Lehner.

To enact section 2151.411 of the Revised Code to require generally that siblings in the custody of a public children services agency be placed together.

S. B. No. 164-Senator Obhof.

Cosponsors: Senators Bacon, Jones, LaRose, Seitz.

To amend sections 6103.04 and 6117.05 and to enact section 6119.061 of the Revised Code to declare that a water resource project of a regional water and sewer district remains under the jurisdiction of the district after the municipal annexation of the territory where the project is located, to establish contracting authority for regional water and sewer districts regarding the conveyance of water resource projects to municipal corporations, and to expand the scope of the contracting authority of a county sewer district when conveying water supply facilities and sewer facilities to a municipal corporation.

S. B. No. 165-Senators Obhof, Grendell.

Cosponsors: Senators Faber, Hughes, Jones, Jordan, Schaffer, Seitz.

To amend sections 3301.079, 3313.60, and 3313.603 of the Revised Code to include content on specified historical documents in the state academic standards and in the high school American history and government curriculum.
