Pursuant to Senate Rule No. 3, the Clerk called the Senate to order.

Senator Jordan was selected to preside according to the rule.

The journal of the last legislative day was read and approved.

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS

The amendments of the House of Representatives to:

Am. S. B. No. 71-Senator Manning. Cosponsors: Senators Schaffer, Wagoner, Widener, Bacon, Beagle, Daniels, Hite, Hughes, LaRose, Obhof, Patton. Representatives Letson, Barnes, Beck, Blessing, Boose, Fende, Goyal, Luckie, Lundy, Milkovich, Murray, Williams, Yuko.

To amend section 5709.081 of the Revised Code to authorize property tax exemption for municipally owned facilities housing independent professional minor league baseball teams, having been informally passed, were taken up.

The question being, "Shall the Senate concur in the amendments of the House of Representatives?"

On the motion of Senator LaRose, the amendments of the House of Representatives to, **Am. S. B. No. 71**, were informally passed and retained their place on the calendar.

INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 177-Senator Turner.

To amend sections 3314.03 and 3326.11 and to enact section 3302.042 of the Revised Code to require public high schools that receive federal school improvement grant moneys to establish student advisory committees.

S. B. No. 178-Senators Seitz, Wilson.
Cosponsors: Senators Beagle, Wagoner, Tavares, Turner.

To amend sections 109.43, 149.351, 149.38, 149.39, 149.41, 149.411, 149.412, 149.42, 307.801, 1901.41, and 3313.29 and to enact section 149.381 of the Revised Code to limit the forfeiture amount and attorney's fees a person may recover for the unlawful destruction or disposal of a record of a public

office, to establish a four-year statute of limitations for the commencement of a civil action for injunctive relief or to recover a forfeiture for such unlawful conduct, to require one-half of all forfeiture amounts recovered to be paid to the state for use by the state archives, to revise the Ohio Historical Society's procedure for selecting records of historical value before political subdivisions dispose of them, to allow the Attorney General to offer programs regarding the records retention procedure, and to move the date for meetings of a county microfilming board.

S. B. No. 179-Senator Wilson.

Cosponsors: Senators Sawyer, Tavares, Kearney, Schaffer.

To amend section 1505.11 and to enact sections 1505.12, 1505.13, and 4503.515 of the Revised Code to create the "Ohio Geology" license plate and to require the Ohio Geology Advisory Council to establish and administer a grant program utilizing the contributions that are paid by persons who obtain the license plate.

On the motion of Senator LaRose, the Senate adjourned until Thursday, June 2, 2011 at 9:30 a.m.
