To enact section 6111.60 of the Revised Code to require the Director of Environmental Protection to consider, to the extent allowable under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, specified factors before issuing NPDES permits for publicly owned sewerage systems, requiring and approving long-term control plans for wet weather discharges from publicly owned sewerage systems, and enforcing provisions of that Act as applied to publicly owned sewerage systems, were taken up.

The question being, "Shall the Senate concur in the amendments of the House of Representatives?"

To amend sections 5747.98 and 5751.98 and to enact sections 5747.78 and 5751.54 of the Revised Code to allow a credit against the personal income tax or commercial activity tax for the installation of an alternative fuel facility.
