The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Pelanda was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 429-Representatives Bishoff, Henne.

To amend sections 149.43 and 149.45 of the Revised Code to make records kept by private police departments subject to the Public Records Law, to exclude private police officer's residential and familial information from the definition of public record, and to permit a private police officer to request a public office to redact the private police officer's residential and familial information from the public office's public records, and to amend the version of section 149.43 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect March 20, 2015, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

H. B. No. 430-Representatives Kunze, Stinziano.

To amend sections 3905.01, 3905.06, and 3905.40 and to enact section 3905.063 of the Revised Code to regulate self-service storage facilities.

H. B. No. 431-Representatives Sears, Henne.

To create the Workers' Compensation and Medicaid Eligibility Study Committee.

To enact sections 5101.39, 5101.40, and 5101.41 of the Revised Code to establish the Ohio Community and Neighborhood Service Commission.

To amend section 5164.01 and to enact section 5164.09 of the Revised Code regarding Medicaid coverage of dental services for the eligibility expansion group authorized by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.

To enact section 3304.55 of the Revised Code to create the Disability Accommodations through Technology Council.

To amend sections 121.02 and 121.03 and to enact section 121.77 of the Revised Code to create the Department of Grants and Philanthropic Gestures.

To enact section 5.2296 of the Revised Code to designate October 7 as Moses Fleetwood Walker Day.

To amend sections 3313.60 and 3319.073 and to enact sections 3314.031 and 3326.091 of the Revised Code with respect to age-appropriate student instruction in child sexual abuse and sexual violence prevention and in-service staff training in child sexual abuse prevention.

To amend sections 3109.51, 3109.78, 3109.79, 3109.80, and 3313.649 and to enact sections 3109.81 to 3109.94 of the Revised Code regarding temporary physical care powers of attorney for children.

To enact section 5533.641 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 65 in Wood County as the "Staff Sergeant Bradley C. Hart Memorial Roadway."

To amend sections 3302.031 and 3313.534 of the Revised Code with respect to school district policies and reports on violent, disruptive, or inappropriate behavior.

To amend sections 145.58, 145.584, 742.45, 5505.01, and 5505.28 and to enact sections 145.585, 742.452, and 5505.282 of the Revised Code, and to amend the version of section 5505.01 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2015, to provide health insurance benefits for the surviving spouse and dependents of a police officer, correctional officer, or firefighter killed in the line of duty.

To enact section 4507.25 of the Revised Code to require the Registrar of Motor Vehicles and deputy registrars to furnish every person who renews a driver's or commercial driver's license with a written summary of the changes

in the motor vehicle traffic, equipment, and crimes laws that were enacted since the person was last issued a driver's or commercial driver's license.

H. B. No. 445-Representative Hagan, R.

To amend section 2949.25 of the Revised Code to require the Governor and the Director of Rehabilitation and Correction to be present at the execution of a death sentence.

H. B. No. 446-Representative Rogers.

To amend section 3318.031 and to enact section 3301.80 of the Revised Code to require the State Board of Education to adopt rules prescribing standards for safety enhancements to new public and nonpublic school facilities and to require the Ohio School Facilities Commission to revise its construction and design standards to comply with the State Board's standards.
