RE: Protest of Amended Senate Bill 238

Pursuant to Article II, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Ohio which states, "Any member of either house shall have the right to protest against any act, or resolution thereof; and such protest, and the reasons therefor, shall, without alteration, commitment, or delay, be entered upon the journal," file the following protest to be entered upon the journal:

I State Representative Mike Foley, protest the Ohio House's decision to end debate, refusal to consider amendments, and haste in passing Amended Senate Bill 238.

I had hoped to have the opportunity to offer an amendment to Senate Bill 238 but due to a rarely used procedural move I was unable present my amendment before the General Assembly for consideration. The amendment was very simple and would have allowed early in-person voting at multiple polling locations. Ohioans in any given county could have benefited if this amendment would have become part of the bill, but the amendment never had the chance to be offered. As Representatives of Ohio's 99 House districts we

are entrusted by the people to consider the bills and amendments in full, allowing for debate and an up or down vote. Refusing to let members in the General Assembly offer amendments is a disservice to the people of the State of Ohio; especially when considering legislation that will have huge repercussions for Ohioans.

In Cuyahoga County, the county where my district is located, Senate Bill 238 is going to have extraordinary consequences. In the 2012 general election over 45,000 people in Cuyahoga County used early in-person voting.

African-Americans accounted for nearly 77% of all early in-person votes. African-American voters were also almost 20 times more likely use early in-person voting than white voters. Senate Bill 238 will severely impact African-American voters in my district and districts across the state. It is reprehensible that as we are silencing the voices of minorities across the state, we are also silencing the voices of those elected to represent the people of Ohio.

For the aforementioned reasons, I protest the House's decision to silence debate and the refusal to consider amendments to Amended S.B. 238, as well as the House's decision to pass Amended S.B. 238.
