INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 476-Representative McGregor.

To enact section 5533.255 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of U.S. Route 40 in Clark County as the "Staff Sergeant Wesley Williams Memorial Highway."

H. B. No. 477-Representative Brown.

To authorize the conveyance of state-owned real property and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 478-Representative Boose.
Cosponsor: Representative Blessing.

To amend section 5725.33 of the Revised Code to eliminate the requirement that a taxpayer receive a federal New Markets tax credit in order to qualify for the state New Markets tax credit, to allow taxpayers to claim the credit earlier in the credit schedule, and to allow credit-eligible investments to be made in low-income community businesses that derive 15% or more of annual revenue from the rental or sale of real property.

Said bills were considered the first time.

To amend section 2919.27 of the Revised Code to provide that service of a protection order or consent agreement upon a person is not necessary for the person to be convicted of the offense of violating a protection order if the prosecution proves that the person had actual notice of the order or agreement and that the person recklessly violated its terms.
