The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Hackett was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 243-Representatives Slaby, Stinziano.

Cosponsors: Representatives Antonio, Beck, Brenner, Celebrezze, Curtin, Fedor, Gerberry, Grossman, Hagan, R., Henne.

To amend sections 959.99, 2152.19, 2903.213, 2903.214, 2919.26, and 3113.31 of the Revised Code to require a child who is adjudicated a delinquent child for cruelty to a companion animal to undergo a psychological evaluation and, if recommended, counseling, to require the court to sentence other offenders who commit that offense to probation supervision, and to include the protection of companion animals in temporary protection orders, domestic violence protection orders, anti-stalking protection orders, and related protection orders.

To amend sections 9.04, 109.42, 109.71, 109.97, 124.34, 2152.16, 2305.111, 2307.53, 2901.02, 2903.01, 2907.02, 2907.03, 2907.04, 2907.05, 2907.17, 2907.18, 2909.24, 2923.02, 2929.02, 2929.021, 2929.022, 2929.023, 2929.024, 2929.03, 2929.04, 2929.05, 2929.06, 2929.13, 2929.14, 2929.19, 2929.34, 2937.222, 2941.14, 2941.148, 2941.1418, 2941.1419, 2941.1420, 2945.06, 2945.38, 2945.42, 2945.57, 2950.01, 2950.11, 2953.08, 2953.11, 2953.21, 2967.01, 2967.05, 2967.18, 2967.19, 2967.193, 2971.01, 2971.03, 2971.07, 3107.07, 3311.82, 3319.081, 3319.16, 4715.30, 4717.05, 4717.14, 4723.281, 4730.25, 4731.22, 4734.36, 4757.361, 4760.13, 4762.13, 4765.114, 4774.13, 4778.14, 5101.56, and 5120.61 of the Revised Code to make the statutory authorization and procedure for imposing a sentence of death apply to rape, sexual battery, and unlawful sexual conduct with a minor when the offense is committed by an offender who previously has been convicted of, pleaded guilty to, or been adjudicated a delinquent child for committing any of those offenses or the former offense of felonious sexual penetration; to name those offenses when committed by such an offender aggravated rape, aggravated rape of a child, aggravated sexual battery, aggravated sexual

battery of a child, and aggravated unlawful sexual conduct with a minor and classify them as felonies of the first degree and capital offenses; to generally retain for those new offenses all special provisions and procedures that currently apply with respect to rape, sexual battery, and unlawful sexual conduct with a minor; and to amend the version of section 2950.11 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2014, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

H. B. No. 245-Representative Barborak.

To amend section 319.302 of the Revised Code to extend the 10% and 2.5% partial property tax "rollback" exemptions to new and replacement levies approved at the 2013 general election and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 246-Representatives Rogers, Blair.

Cosponsors: Representatives Cera, Barborak, Celebrezze, Antonio, Maag, Gerberry, Patterson, Slesnick, Stinziano, Henne, Beck.

To amend section 5747.01 and to enact sections 5747.82 and 5751.031 of the Revised Code to allow recent college graduates to claim an income tax deduction for qualified higher education expenses and allow employers of recent college graduates to deduct the employer's costs of employing the graduate from the employer's gross receipts subject to the commercial activities tax.

H. B. No. 247-Representative Stebelton.

Cosponsors: Representatives Huffman, Butler, Sears, Becker, Lynch.

To amend section 3701.85 of the Revised Code to make clear that any person may perform automated external defibrillation.

Said bills were considered the first time.
