INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 626-Representative Barnes.

To enact section 3345.43 of the Revised Code to enact the "Respect Your Date Act" to require each state institution of higher education to adopt a policy regarding dating violence and rape on campus.

H. B. No. 627-Representatives Foley, Hagan, R.

Cosponsors: Representatives Ramos, Driehaus, Bishoff, Antonio, Slesnick, Sheehy, Fedor, Barborak.

To enact section 3314.088 of the Revised Code to prohibit community schools from using state funds to hire a lobbyist or for public relations services.

H. B. No. 628-Representatives Celebrezze, Antonio.

Cosponsors: Representatives Foley, Barborak, Hagan, R.

To authorize the Inspector General to investigate the Office of the Attorney General to determine whether wrongful acts or omissions have been or are being committed and to declare an emergency.

Said bills were considered the first time.
