INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 629-Representatives Brenner, Gonzales.

Cosponsors: Representatives Becker, Boose, Derickson, Grossman, Henne, Hill, Perales, Ruhl, Wachtmann.

To amend sections 3301.0710 and 3301.0715 and to enact section 3301.132 of the Revised Code, and to amend Section 10 of Am. Sub. H.B. 487 of the 130th General Assembly with regard to the administration of state primary and secondary education assessments.

H. B. No. 630-Representative Beck.

To enact section 5502.69 of the Revised Code to require law enforcement agencies to submit a written report to the Division of Criminal Justice Services of the Department of Public Safety regarding the death of any person who is shot by the law enforcement agency's law enforcement officers and to require all law enforcement officers to complete in-service firearm training if in any year five or more of the deceased were unarmed.

H. B. No. 631-Representative Henne.

Cosponsors: Representatives Bishoff, Derickson, Ruhl.

To amend sections 149.43 and 3319.111 and to enact section 3319.113 of the Revised Code and to amend the version of section 149.43 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect on March 20, 2015, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date to exclude evaluations conducted pursuant to the Ohio Teacher Evaluation System from the Public Records Law and to exempt teachers participating in the Ohio Teacher Residency Program from those evaluations.

Said bills were considered the first time.

In line 110, delete " A" and insert " (a) Except as provided in division (B)(14)(b) of this section, a"

Between lines 117 and 118, insert:

" (b) This section applies to a person described in division (B)(14)(a) of this section with respect to the minor child's wire or electronic communication with a noncustodial parent if, in an action under Chapter 3105. or 3109. of the Revised Code, the court orders that the minor child have a means of wire or electronic communication with a noncustodial parent that is set up to allow communication only with the noncustodial parent."

In line 20, delete " legal officer."; strike through the first "or"; after the comma insert " or chief legal officer."

In line 22, after "the" insert " prosecuting attorney."

In line 23, after "magistrate" insert " , or chief legal officer"

In line 2 of the title, delete "or"

In line 3 of the title, delete everything before "to"

In line 5 of the title, after "offense" insert "and to authorize the chief legal officer of a municipal corporation to issue an investigative subpoena for any misdemeanor offense"
