The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Ruhl was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills and joint resolution were introduced:

H. B. No. 310-Representative Ruhl.

Cosponsors: Representatives Terhar, Adams, J., Grossman, Milkovich.

To amend sections 955.011, 955.43, and 955.99 of the Revised Code to include persons diagnosed with posttraumatic stress disorder as mobility impaired persons for purposes of the statutes governing assistance dogs and to prohibit misrepresentation of a dog as an assistance dog.

H. B. No. 311-Representatives Boose, Retherford.

To amend sections 319.302, 323.152, 4503.065, 5705.19, 5733.41, 5741.03, 5747.02, and 5747.025 of the Revised Code and to amend Sections 803.80 and 803.90 of Am. Sub. H.B. 59 of the 130th General Assembly to correct and modify recent amendments to tax-related law, to lengthen the maximum term of a property tax levy for the purpose of zoological parks operated or supported by a county, and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 312-Representative Johnson.

Cosponsor: Representative Smith.

To amend sections 4905.31 and 4928.34 of the Revised Code to permit a public utility electric light company to recover costs of an economic and job retention program from all public utility electric light customers in Ohio.

H. B. No. 313-Representatives Kunze, Hackett.

To amend sections 1751.25, 3901.043, 3901.045, 3901.17, 3901.32, 3901.321, 3901.33, 3901.34, 3901.341, 3901.35, 3901.36, 3901.62, 3901.63, 3901.64, 3903.72, 3903.721, 3903.83, 3907.14, 3913.01, 3913.34, 3915.04, 3915.071, 3915.072, 3921.21, 3925.08, 3939.01, and 3953.15, to amend, for the purpose of adopting new section numbers as indicated in parentheses, sections 3903.72 (3903.723) and 3903.721 (3903.724), to enact new sections

3903.72 and 3903.721 and sections 3901.351, 3901.371, 3901.372, 3901.373, 3901.374, 3901.375, 3901.376, 3901.377, 3901.378, 3901.41, 3901.621, 3901.631, 3903.722, 3903.725, 3903.726, 3903.727, 3903.728, 3903.729, 3903.7210, 3903.7211, and 3906.01 to 3906.15, and to repeal sections 3907.09, 3907.10, 3907.11, and 3907.13 of the Revised Code to enact the Insurance Regulatory Modernization Act to revise the insurance laws regarding alternative investments, holding company systems, risk management, reserves kept for life insurance policies, automated transactions, reinsurance, and mergers and consolidations.

H. B. No. 314-Representatives Baker, Kunze.

Cosponsors: Representatives Hagan, C., Landis, Antonio, Sprague, Boose, Smith, Stebelton, Hood, Green, Sears, Driehaus, Patterson, O'Brien, Becker.

To amend sections 4715.30, 4723.481, and 4730.41 and to enact sections 3719.061, 4723.283, 4725.191, 4730.252, and 4731.229 of the Revised Code to require a prescriber to obtain written informed consent from a minor's parent, guardian, or other person responsible for the minor before issuing a controlled substance prescription to the minor and to establish sanctions for a prescriber's failure to comply with this requirement.

H. B. No. 315-Representative Wachtmann.

To enact section 3711.30 of the Revised Code to require hospital reporting of neonatal abstinence syndrome.

H. B. No. 316-Representative Wachtmann.

To amend sections 5164.01, 5167.01, and 5167.03 and to enact sections 5164.151, 5167.15, and 5167.151 of the Revised Code regarding Medicaid-covered community behavioral health services.

H. B. No. 317-Representative Sears.

To amend sections 2925.02, 2925.03, 3313.617, 3314.08, 5120.113, and 5162.01, to enact sections 103.41, 103.411, 103.412, 2747.01, 2747.02, 2747.03, 2747.04, 2747.05, 2747.06, 2747.07, 2747.08, 2747.09, 3314.362, 3314.38, 3317.036, 3317.24, 4729.553, 5162.133, 5162.70, and 5163.04, and to repeal sections 101.39 and 101.391 of the Revised Code regarding reforms relating to Medicaid, fraud committed against the state, penalties for certain drug offenses committed against pregnant women, non-opiate medication for released inmates, prescription-related identification requirements, and education for individuals without a high school diploma, and to amend the versions of sections 3317.01 and 3317.022 of the Revised Code that are scheduled to take effect July 1, 2014.

H. J. R. No. 8-Representative Becker.

Proposing to amend Sections 2 and 7 of Article II, Section 6 of Article IV, Section 9 of Article V, Sections 3 and 4 of Article VI, and Section 1 of Article XIV; to enact new Section 8 of Article V; to enact Section 5 of Article X and Section 15 of Article XVIII; and to repeal Section 8 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to institute term limits for certain elected and appointed officials and to increase the term limits for members of the General Assembly.

Said bills and joint resolution were considered the first time.
