The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Becker was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 655-Representatives Beck, Adams, J.
Cosponsors: Representatives Milkovich, Retherford.

To amend sections 122.17 and 122.171 of the Revised Code to reduce the job retention and capital investment requirements of the Job Retention Tax Credit for businesses in targeted areas or industries, to require that a Job Creation or Retention Tax Credit awarded to such a business equal 100% of its new or retained income tax withholding, and to modify the credits' annual report requirement to provide that employers must submit reports only if required by the Director of Development Services.

H. B. No. 656-Representatives Beck, Milkovich.
Cosponsor: Representative Stebelton.

To amend sections 3709.09, 3730.01 to 3730.09, 3730.11, and 3730.99; to amend, for the purpose of adopting new section numbers as indicated in parentheses, sections 3730.01 (4785.01), 3730.02 (4785.02), 3730.03 (4785.05), 3730.04 (4785.06), 3730.05 (4785.07), 3730.06 (4785.08), 3730.07 (4785.09), 3730.08 (4785.10), 3730.09 (4785.11), 3730.11 (4785.18), and 3730.99 (4785.99); to enact sections 4785.03, 4785.04, 4785.051, 4785.12, and 4785.14 to 4785.17; and to repeal section 3730.10 of the Revised Code to create the State Board of Body Modification, to require licensure of tattoo and body piercing artists, and to make other changes to the tattooing and piercing laws.

H. B. No. 657-Representatives Beck, Milkovich.
Cosponsor: Representative Ruhl.

To amend section 3717.01 and to enact section 3717.54 of the Revised Code to allow a restaurant to permit a dog that is a companion animal in outdoor dining areas if certain conditions are satisfied.

H. B. No. 658-Representative Gonzales.

To enact section 5.2298 of the Revised Code to designate September as "Childhood Obesity Awareness Month."

H. B. No. 659-Representative Sprague.

To amend section 3781.25 and to enact sections 3781.34, 3781.341, 3781.342, 3781.36, 4905.041, 4913.01, 4913.03, 4913.05, 4913.07, 4913.09, 4913.13, 4913.15, 4913.151, 4913.152, 4913.16, 4913.17, 4913.171, 4913.19, 4913.21, 4913.22, 4913.23, 4913.25, 4913.27, 4913.29, 4913.31, 4913.43, 4913.45, 4913.47, 4913.50, and 4913.52 of the Revised Code regarding the enforcement of the law governing the protection of underground utility facilities.

H. B. No. 660-Representatives Henne, Antonio.

Cosponsors: Representatives Buchy, Butler, Hackett, Maag, Perales, Sprague, Retherford.

To amend section 128.021 of the Revised Code to require the statewide emergency services internet protocol network steering committee to update the operational standards for public safety answering points.

H. B. No. 661-Representative Stebelton.

To amend sections 101.27, 141.011, 141.04, 325.03, 325.04, 325.06, 325.08, 325.09, 325.10, 325.11, 325.14, 325.15, 325.18, 505.24, 507.09, and 5301.12 of the Revised Code and to amend Section 307.10 of Am. Sub. H.B. 59 of the 130th General Assembly to reinstate the cost of living adjustment for members of the General Assembly and statewide elected executive officers; to increase the compensation of justices and judges of the courts, county elected officials, township trustees and fiscal officers, and board of elections members and to reinstate the annual cost of living adjustment to their compensation; to reduce the number of population classifications used to determine the compensation of county elected officials; to make an appropriation; and to declare an emergency.

H. B. No. 662-Representatives Duffey, McGregor.

To enact sections 4781.401, 4934.01, 4934.02, 4934.03, 4934.04, 4934.05, 4934.06, 4934.07, 4934.08, 4934.09, 4934.10, 4934.11, 4934.12, 4934.13, 4934.14, 4934.15, 4934.16, 4934.17, 4934.18, 4934.20, 4934.21, 4934.22, 4934.24, 5311.082, and 5321.061 of the Revised Code regarding measurement of public utility service to premises administered by a landlord, condominium unit owners association, or manufactured home park operator.

H. B. No. 663-Representatives Buchy, Huffman.

To amend section 149.43 and to enact sections 2949.221 and 2949.222 of the Revised Code to provide confidentiality and license protection for persons and entities involved in executing a sentence of capital punishment by lethal injection and to void as against public policy any agreement that prevents the supplying of any drug or drugs to be used in executing a sentence of capital punishment by lethal injection, and to amend the version of section 149.43 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect on March 20, 2015, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that date.

Said bills were considered the first time.
