INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 369-Representative Sprague.

To amend sections 340.03, 340.08, 340.09, 340.15, 1739.05, 5119.21, 5119.22, 5119.23, and 5119.25 and to enact sections 1751.621, 3923.521, and 5164.09 of the Revised Code, to amend Sections 327.10, 327.80, and 327.120 of Am. Sub. H.B. 59 of the 130th General Assembly to require the Medicaid program and health insurers to cover certain services for recipients with opioid addictions; to establish requirements for boards of alcohol, drug addiction, and mental health services regarding treatment services for opioid addiction to help defray payroll costs associated with a court's employment of drug court case managers; to provide a state share of the capital costs of recovery housing projects; and to make appropriations.
