INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bill was introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 261-Senators Bacon, Manning.

Cosponsors: Senators Patton, Obhof, Seitz, Brown.

To amend sections 2151.34, 2903.214, 2919.27, and 3113.31 of the Revised Code to provide that a person who recklessly violates a protection order issued upon a petition alleging that the person committed an act of domestic violence, menacing by stalking, or a sexually oriented offense, is guilty of the offense of violating a protection order if the person has actual notice of the protection order, notwithstanding that the person has not been served with a copy of the protection order, to increase the penalty for violating a protection order or consent agreement issued or entered into in order to protect a family or household member from domestic violence, and to require law enforcement agencies to enter certain protection orders into the National Crime Information Center Protection Order File.
