H. C. R. No. 32-Representative Gonzales, et al.

To designate a week in July 2014 as Independent Retailers Week.

To the Committee on Workforce and Economic Development.

To acknowledge the Governmental Accounting Standards Board standards 67 and 68 and to pledge the General Assembly's continued support of Ohio's public employers and retirement systems in their mission to provide secure and sustainable retirement, disability, and survivor benefits to Ohio's public employees.

To amend sections 2903.211 and 2917.21 of the Revised Code to expand the offenses of menacing by stalking and telecommunications harassment and to prohibit a person from knowingly causing another person to believe that the offender will cause physical harm or mental distress to a family or household member of the other person.

To enact section 5533.581 of the Revised Code to designate the portion of United States Route 33 known as the Nelsonville Bypass in Hocking County and Athens County the "Governor Ted Strickland Highway."

To amend section 1739.05 and to enact sections 1751.68 and 3923.84 of the Revised Code to require health insurers to offer coverage for hearing aids.

To amend sections 2151.34, 2903.214, 2919.27, and 3113.31 of the Revised Code to provide that a person who recklessly violates a protection order issued upon a petition alleging that the person committed an act of domestic violence, menacing by stalking, or a sexually oriented offense, is guilty of the offense of violating a protection order if the person has actual notice of the protection order, notwithstanding that the person has not been served with a copy of the protection order, to increase the penalty for violating a protection order or consent agreement issued or entered into in order to protect a family or household member from domestic violence, and to require law enforcement

agencies to enter certain protection orders into the National Crime Information Center Protection Order File.
