To amend Section 733.10 of Am. Sub. H.B. 59 of the 130th General Assembly to permit up to two additional school "calamity" days in the 2013-2014 school year; to authorize, for the 2013-2014 school year, schools to make up in half-hour increments "calamity" days missed in excess of the number of days permitted by law; to permit the Superintendent of Public Instruction to delay the return of the student scores for the elementary state achievement assessments for the 2013-2014 school year; to permit school districts to hold up to two additional in-service days for the 2013-2014 school year; and to declare an emergency.
