S. C. R. No. 40-Senator Gentile.

Cosponsors: Senators Cafaro, Balderson, Turner, Schiavoni, Kearney.

To urge the Congress of the United States to mitigate the debilitating effects of type 1 diabetes and excessive future health care costs by increasing funding to the National Institutes of Health for research to promote the widespread and affordable availability of a closed-loop diabetic system, referred to as the "artificial pancreas," and islet cell transplantation.
