INTRODUCTION AND FIRST CONSIDERATION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced and considered the first time:

S. B. No. 368-Senator Schiavoni.

To amend sections 4123.57 and 4123.58 of the Revised Code to make an individual who has lost the use of a body part due to a brain injury or spinal cord injury eligible for partial disability and permanent total disability compensation under the Workers' Compensation Law.

S. B. No. 369-Senator Hughes.

Cosponsors: Senators Patton, Seitz, Brown, Cafaro.

To amend section 3705.23 of the Revised Code and to amend the version of section 3705.23 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect March 20, 2015, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date, for the purpose of restricting to whom a certified copy of a death certificate containing the decedent's social security number may be issued.
