To amend sections 1901.20, 1907.02, and 4511.094; to amend, for the purpose of adopting a new section number as indicated in parentheses, section 4511.093 (4511.043); to enact sections 3937.411, 4511.095, 4511.096, 4511.097, 4511.098, 4511.099, 4511.0910, 4511.0911, 4511.0912, and 4511.0913; to enact new sections 4511.092 and 4511.093; and to repeal section 4511.092 of the Revised Code to establish conditions for the use by local authorities of traffic law photo-monitoring devices to detect certain traffic law violations, was considered the third time.

The question being, "Shall the bill, **Sub. S. B. No. 342**, pass?"
