In memory of the Honorable Edwin T. Hofstetter.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Ohio:

WHEREAS, The members of the House of Representatives of the 127th General Assembly of Ohio were deeply saddened to learn of the death of the Honorable Edwin T. Hofstetter and extend our heartfelt condolences to his family and friends; and

WHEREAS, Edwin Hofstetter was a dedicated and devoted public servant whose exemplary career serves as an inspiration for others. A former farmer and an attorney, he served a short stint as a justice of the peace before he was elected a Geauga County commissioner in 1956, Geauga County prosecutor in 1960, a member of the Ohio House of Representatives in 1966, and a judge of the 11th Ohio District Court of Appeals in 1968, and after retiring in 1982, he became a visiting judge. He was also an active member of the Chardon Jaycees, Rotary Club, and United Methodist Church, and he was inducted into the Geauga County Republican Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, Edwin Hofstetter's regard for improving the quality of life in our society was clearly evident in his personal sacrifices of time and effort to his friends and family, including his wife, the late Anna May, his four children, Beth, Edwina, William, and the late Nancy, and his ten grandchildren and eleven great-grandchildren. Giving generously of his energy and abilities in all of his endeavors, he displayed exceptional concern and insight, and his absence will be keenly felt; and

WHEREAS, Edwin Hofstetter always used his talents to the benefit of others, and the laurels of his life stand as a tribute not only to him but also to those he left behind. The world is a richer place for his having been in it, and the legacy of care and commitment he established will surely live on. He will be sorely missed; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the House of Representatives of the 127th General Assembly of Ohio, in adopting this Resolution, express a profound sense of loss and sincere regret at the death of the Honorable Edwin T. Hofstetter and, in so doing, pay tribute to the memory of an outstanding man; and be it further
